**Regular Meeting**

At a regular meeting of the Board of Education of Fresno Unified School District, held on September 10, 2008, there were present Members Asadoorian, Davis, Johnson, Mills, Nunez, and President Vang. *Member Ryan was absent.* Also present was Superintendent Hanson.

President Vang convened the meeting at 4:30 p.m. in the Board Room and immediately adjourned to Closed Session to address items 1 through 5.

At 5:30 p.m., Member Davis announced to the public that the Board will RECONVENE at 5:40 p.m. The Board of Education RECONVENED at 5:45 p.m. in the Board Room with Student Members Facciani and Thomas present.

**Staff Present**

CFO Quinto, Associate Superintendents Marinovich, Mecum, Tucker, CIO Turnbull, CTO Madden, Assistant Superintendents, Bengel, Coronado, Evans, Franks, Jones, Locker, Maldonado, and Smits. *Associate Superintendent Persaud was absent.*

**Reporting Out of Closed Session:**

1. The Board was informed of the administrative transfer of Denise Montoya to Vice Principal I/Program Manager, Ewing Elementary School.

**Pledge of Allegiance**

Viking Elementary parent Tony Rodriguez led the Pledge of Allegiance. Mr. Rodriguez wears many hats at Viking and recently has helped to raise several thousand dollars for the student body.

**Reports from Student Board Representatives**

Student Board Representative Ar Nee Vang provided the Board with an update and report from Student Board Representatives meeting hosted by Duncan Polytechnical High School. He acknowledged the student ambassadors' from Yosemite Middle school.

## **Resolution in Recognition of Hispanic Heritage Month from September 15 through October 15, 2008**

ADOPTED, as recommended, Resolution recognizing the month of September 15 through October 15, 2008, as Hispanic Heritage Month. All schools are encouraged to commemorate this time with appropriate instructional activities. Johnny Baltierra, President of AMAE accepted the Resolution.

Member Nunez moved for approval, seconded by Member Davis, which carried a roll call vote of 8-0-1 as follows: Student Members Facciani, Thomas, Members Asadoorian, Davis, Johnson, Mills, Nunez, and President Vang. *Member Ryan was absent.*

### **McLane and Bullard High Schools – Outstanding Athletic Achievement**

The Board and Superintendent recognized McLane and Bullard for their outstanding athletic achievement. McLane's Baseball Team took Division III Central Section Championship. Bullard's Boys Volleyball took Division 1 Central Section and finished the year ranked 7<sup>th</sup> in the nation. Bullard's Boys Tennis won an unprecedented third straight Division I Boys Tennis Championship.

### **Superintendent Hanson reported out the following:**

- **Flags to Fly at Half-Staff in Honor of 9/11 Victims**  
President Bush has proclaimed tomorrow, September 11, as Patriot Day to honor the victims of the 9/11 attack, as well as all of those who performed heroically in the wake of the tragedy. Tomorrow all flags in Fresno Unified will be flown at half-staff in recognition of Patriot Day.
- **Presenting at the State Board of Education Meeting September 11**  
Shared with the Board and community, that tomorrow, he will be joining Long Beach Unified Superintendent Chris Steinhauser in Sacramento at the State Board of Education's regularly scheduled meeting to present an update on the partnership, at the request of State Superintendent O'Connell.
- **Ahwahnee's Environmental Science Magnet Getting National Media Attention**  
Reported that Ahwahnee Middle School's Environmental Science magnet program is getting national media attention and a news crew from the national CBS Evening News will visit Ahwahnee next week to do a story on the new magnet program. As you well know, the program gives students hands-on learning experience in studying the environment, biology, and chemistry.
- **'Road to College' Bus Tour to Stop at Bullard High School**  
Reported that one of the high schools is on the "CSU/AT&T Road to College Tour" and the tour bus will stop at Bullard High School on September 29. The bus wrapped in CSU's "How to Get to College" poster – is traveling throughout the state this fall and they are thrilled that they are one of the stops. Students will be able to use laptop computers on the bus to connect to CSU's online planning and application Website.

Shared with the Board and community that their own Jim Lloyd was named 2008 Administrator of the Year by the San Joaquin Valley Council for Social Studies. He will be honored next month at a council event.

President Vang announced that the Board received a minor correction to the resolution for Agenda Item A-8 and the Administration is pulling A-5.

Member Nunez questioned if the Board needed to take a roll call vote on Agenda Item A-8.

Superintendent Hanson stated that all consent agenda items are considered to be routine by the Board of Education and will be enacted by one motion.

On motion by Member Davis, seconded by Member Nunez, the Consent Agenda, exclusive of Agenda Items: A-5, A-7, and A-11, approved on a roll call vote of 8-0-1 as follows: Student Members Facciani, Thomas, Members Asadoorian, Davis, Johnson, Mills, Nunez, and President Vang. *Member Ryan was absent.*

**A-1, Personnel List**

APPROVED, as recommended, the Personnel List, Appendix A, as submitted.

**A-2, Findings of Fact and Recommendations of District Administrative Board**

ADOPTED, as recommended, the Findings of Fact and Recommendations of District Administrative Panels resulting from hearings on expulsion and readmittance cases conducted during the period since the July 30, 2008, Regular Board Meeting.

**A-3, One Provisional Internship Permit in Hard to Fill Teaching Area**

APPROVED, as recommended, one Provisional Internship Permit (PIP) to hire Angie Bustos on a PIP in the area of Foundational Mathematics to teach students at Sequoia Middle School. Ms. Bustos served the students at Sequoia Middle School for the 2007/2008 school year on a PIP. She will complete coursework to enter a university internship by June, 2009.

**A-4, Contract with School Innovations & Advocacy Inc. (SIA) for State Mandated Cost Claiming Services for Fiscal Year 2008/09**

APPROVED, as recommended, a Contract with School Innovations & Advocacy Inc. (SIA) for mandated cost claiming services for fiscal year 2008/09, for claims from fiscal year 2007/08. For 2005/06 and 2006/07, Fresno Unified filed claims of \$4 million and \$4.2 million, respectively. The contract amount is \$120,800 and the contract period is September 11, 2008 through June 30, 2009 with an option to extend for two years at the same annual cost. However, due to the site support service portion being deferred for the first year, the district's actual cost in 2008/09 will be \$55,000. Funding will be provided through the Unrestricted General Funds. Due to the site support service portion being deferred for the first year, the district's actual cost in 2008/09 will be \$55,000.

**A-5, Recommendations for Board Bylaws Revision**

PULLED for consideration from the agenda.

**A-6, Out of State Field Trip for Roosevelt High School**

APPROVED, as recommended, a request for approval of a field trip for seven cross country students and two district chaperones who attended the University of Nevada Invitational in Reno, Nevada on August 29-30, 2008. Total cost of the trip, \$700.00, to be paid with Roosevelt High School Cross Country fundraising.

**A-7, Budget Revision No. 1 for Fiscal Year 2008/09**

PULLED for discussion.

**A-8, Resolution for the 2008/09 Gann Limit**

ADOPTED, as recommended, resolution 2008-22 for adopting the District's Gann Appropriation Limit for fiscal year 2008/09. The Gann Limit is included in the Unaudited Actual Financial Report. Each year the District must approve an appropriation limit level (Gann Limit) in compliance with the State constitution.

**A-9, Change Orders for Ahwahnee Middle School Modernization Project**

RATIFIED, as recommended, Change Orders and backup information for the following bid:

1. Bid #2725, Modernization of Ahwahnee Middle School.

Change Order #2 for \$137,601.71. The new contract amount is \$3,226,651.77. This change order includes, but may not be limited to, removal and disposal of all existing non-bearing walls in building "S" and reconfigure interior of the building to create ten equally sized classrooms. Thirty (30) days to be added to completion time.

Change Order #5 for no cost. The new contract amount is \$3,226,651.77. This change order includes, but may not be limited to, the approval of substituted mounting brackets for the wall mounted electrical transformers.

Sufficient funds (\$137,601.71) are available in the 2008/09 Measure K and State Facility Program budgets.

**A-10, Filing of the Notice of Completion for Ahwahnee Middle School Modernization Project**  
RATIFIED, as recommended, the Notice of Completion for Bid #2725, Modernization at Ahwahnee Middle School and has been completed according to plans and specifications. The 10% retention will be released after ratification of the Notice of Completion. Sufficient funds are available in the 2008/09 Measure K and State Facility Program budgets.

**A-11, Claim #08-0520-0180 for (Minor)**  
PULLED for discussion.

President Vang stated the Brown Act requires the public be given an opportunity to speak on matters relating to the school district's business during Board meetings and this Board welcomes public comment as designated on the agenda. Matters presented during Public Comment will be referred to the Superintendent for appropriate follow up. The Board recognizes that Public comment speakers often have very strong feelings regarding school district issues, which may involve individual school district employees or other persons. However, the Board expects all speakers to appreciate the rights of others by conducting themselves in a civil and respectful manner at all times. As Board President, I cannot permit any speaker to discuss confidential information regarding a particular student or employee and must ensure that speakers abide by their obligation to respect the rights of others. The board appreciates your observance of these principles of civility, respect and order, which will best ensure that the right of public comment is safeguarded without compromising the efficient and effective conduct of Board meetings.

**UNSCHEDULED ORAL COMMUNICATIONS**

**Jose Castro**

Expressed concerns with several matters: 1) states on the agenda that staff will be assigned to individual speakers to address their concerns or questions and that process is not being followed; and 2) the lack of parent workshops in the district to assist and help parents, which is the obligation of this district. His final comment was that if the board does not want to comply with their concerns, there is one solution and that will be a resignation document for the entire board.

**Ines Garcia**

Expressed concerns with lack of a parent center for parent involvement at Edison so the parents can get involved to help their children. She requested a response to her concern.

**Maria Castro**

Expressed concerns with the lack of parent involvement at Edison and at all other schools. If they want to see one of their children sitting on the dais one day, they need the assistance to help their children.

Member Nunez stated for correction that Ms. Garcia expressed concerns for a center for parents and not workshop.

**Guadalupe Fuentes**

Expressed concerns with the lack of workshops for the parents in the district. These workshops are necessary for the parents to help their children learn.

UNSCHEDULED ORAL COMMUNICATIONS – continued

**Liz Dodds**

Thanked the Board for approving Destiny a web-based product for better accountability of textbooks and library books in the district and the cost savings to the district of thousands of dollars every year. She thanked the Board for allowing her to work one job. In the past several years, they had to sell snacks to purchase books and supplies for the library at Bullard High School and with the availability of district funds at every school libraries; able to offer all students new books and other resources.

**Tom Nixon**

Informed the Board of his position as a teacher/librarian at Tehipite Middle School and is the central valley representative for the California School Library Association (CSLA). At one of the past meetings with the CSLA, he had the pleasure of informing them that at Fresno Unified, teacher/librarians are valued for their expertise and are supported by the district administration. The school board and superintendent are aware of the research connection that shows that students with higher test scores come from schools with strong library programs. This is all due to the hard work of the Board, Superintendent and Director of the Instructional Media Center and on behalf of his colleagues; thanked the Board and Superintendent for their hard work and continued support.

**Corky Luce**

Provided the board with health care information and stated that the Board of Fresno Unified needs to take a stand on health care for “all” and is looking forward to the resolution presented to the Board at the last meeting to be placed on the agenda at the next board meeting.

**Alicia Crispin**

Expressed concerns with the lack of parent workshops in the district and is requesting the Board provide these workshops for the parents. As parents, they need to be able to help their children to achieve their goals.

**Adelfa Garcia**

Expressed concerns with the lack of parent workshops in the district. These workshops are needed in the district to help parents better assist their children in a better education so they can graduate. She would like a response to her concern.

**John Carlos**

Awaiting a response to his request from the last meeting and tired of waiting for a response. For parents to become active in school and get involved they need the parent workshops in the district and the parents fill discriminated against, because the district does not take them into consideration. He stated that the topic of parent workshops will be placed on the agenda for discussion and consider the possibility of having the parents step aside from the committees and let the district run the DELAC/ELAC meetings. He extended an invitation to the Board and Superintendent to the next DELAC meeting on September 25.

**Margarita Caballero**

Informed the Board that this is her third attempt to get the attention of Board and Superintendent in meeting the needs of parents’ concerns. She is still waiting for response to her request and if this continues, they will get the support of the DELAC parents to help resolve the problems and she is supporting all the parents in attendance tonight as the DELAC president.

**Ernesto Cisneros**

He reminded the Board to please respect the parents and provide them with the necessary workshops that are needed in the district as stated in the Education Code.

President Vang recessed for a BREAK at 7:00 p.m. and RECONVENED at 7:08 p.m.

**B. CONFERENCE/DISCUSSION AGENDA**

**A-7, Budget Revision No. 1 for Fiscal Year 2008/09**

APPROVED, as recommended, Budget Revision No. 1 for fiscal year 2008/09. Periodic updates to Fresno Unified's budget are presented to the Board of Education for approval. Budget Revision No. 1 includes adjustments for the final State adopted budget, adjustment for the actual beginning balances, and necessary adjustments to support the acceptance of various grant awards and other fund adjustments. As a result of the proposed adjustments, the net impact to the Unrestricted General Fund Ending Fund Balance estimated for June 30, 2009, is a decrease of \$400,000 from \$35.1 million to \$34.7 million.

The following individuals addressed the Board with their thoughts regarding this agenda item:

- Thao Vang expressed concerns with translation services at Yosemite Middle School. There have been times the custodian is used as a translator. The school does have a Hmong translator, but due to the lack of funds; hours have been reduced.
- Lee Dau expressed concerns with translation services at Yosemite Middle School for Hmong parents and is requesting assistance for the parents.
- Her Yang expressed concerns with translation services at Yosemite Middle School and is requesting the Board for assistance to help the parents and students of Yosemite Middle School.
- Jose Castro expressed concerns with several matters: 1) when parents come before the board, there are no resolutions to their concerns; 2) lack of funds for EL students and funds to hold parent workshops; and 3) respect for parents. He made a final comment that the district is not complying with state and federal laws and if these matters are not resolved, he will file a complaint with the state department.
- Ernesto Cisneros stated that his request is similar to Mr. Castro's concerns. He believes the board and superintendent are not aware of the federal and state laws. The laws state the district needs to provide funds for EL students and provide workshops to parents. He stated that the superintendent has not made a point to meet with the DELAC committee. He would like a response to these complaints.
- William Her expressed concerns with lack of funding for Hmong translators at Aynesworth Elementary School.

Member Davis moved to approval, seconded by Member Mills, which carried an 8-0-1 vote with *Member Ryan absent*.

President Vang referred these matters to the Superintendent.

B. CONFERENCE/DISCUSSION AGENDA – continued

**A-11, Claim #08-0520-0180 for (Minor)**

DENIED, as recommended, Claim for Damages for (Minor), #08-0520-0180. The matter has been referred to the District's Director of Benefits and Risk Management for further handling.

There was no discussion on this item and Member Davis moved for approval, seconded by Member Asadoorian, which carried an 8-0-1 vote with *Member Ryan absent*.

**B-12, Mini-Grant Awards for History and Social Science Teachers**

PRESENTED by the League of Women Voters of Fresno a mini-grant award for History and Social Science Teachers at the middle schools and high schools.

Associate Superintendent Tucker introduced Ms. Francine Farber from the League of Women Voters who provided the board with an update with the mini-grant awards for History and Social Science Teachers. Using a \$10,000 bequest to the League of Women Voters, and working with administrators from Fresno Unified and Fresno County Office of Education, the League will award \$500 mini-grants to up to 20 teachers in Fresno Unified and County schools. Teachers must make an innovative proposal regarding Constitution Day. Applications will be available in each school on September 17 (Constitution Day), which the teachers will devise a project of their choice with Constitution education for middle and high school teachers will be eligible for one of these mini-grants.

A panel of judges, including Superior Court Judge Hilary Chittick, educators, attorneys and League members will decide on the grants by December, 2008. Successful applicants will present their projects at a public Mini-Grant Expo and have a summary of their projects published in a brochure.

Ms. Farber presented the Board and Superintendent Hanson with their very own copy of the Constitution.

Superintendent Hanson stated that they are very appreciative of the League for this work and look forward to having Fresno Unified be represented under the direction of the district's administrator of the year Jim Lloyd, there is no doubt that this will go well. He thanked the League for their participation in this and making more opportunities available for the students.

Member Asadoorian questioned how teachers will get notification of the application?

Ms. Farber stated they will provide a personal letter or through their department chairperson, but each teacher will receive a copy of the timeline and other detailed information. On December 8, letters will go out to all the applicants informing them if they are recipients' or not of the grant.

**B-13, Annual Student Achievement Results from The California Standards Tests (CST)** PRESENTED by the Office of Research, Evaluation and Assessment (REA) staff the Fresno Unified School District's academic performance during the 2007/08 school year on the California Standard Test (CST) results and Academic Performance Index (API).

Superintendent Hanson stated that this is an annual presentation around the data availability and this year is a little different. In past years they have presented API, the State Accountability System and AYP and in different times and now, they have been released at the same time. He stated that it was a great pleasure to address The Bee's editorial board on the recent successes of the staff.

CAO Marinovich and Executive Director Calhoun provided the Board with a summary of information on Student Achievement from State-Mandated Assessments from the 2007/08 school year. They will present this in three separate sections, first looking at overall student achievement on the California Standards Tests (CSTs). As they reviewed the results, they recognized that there continues to be several crucial challenges in the areas of accountability and student achievement.

*Student Member Facciani departed the Board meeting at 7:35 p.m.*

CAO Marinovich stated that all of the achievement data continues to point in steady growth and the achievement gap persists. The greatest challenges are among the EL students in the area of literacy and English development skills.

- First section will be on the API & AYP
- Second section will be on the Student Achievement Data on the California Standards Test (CST)
- Third section will be on the Major Initiatives for the 2008/08 School Year

Superintendent Hanson stated that they will return to a future Board meeting to discuss more thoroughly and provide more broadly on the work that is actually going on and the things that have been proposed.

**B-14, Matter of Sufficiency of Instruction Materials per Ed Code §60119**

ADOPTED, as recommended, the Resolution in the Matter of Sufficiency of Instructional Materials. The governing Board of each school district is required to hold a public hearing and adopt a resolution stating whether each pupil, including English Learners, has standards-aligned textbooks and instructional materials in these subject areas: English Language Arts, Mathematics, History/Social Science, Science, Health (grades 7-12), Foreign language (grades 7-12) and Science equipment (grades 9-12). Funding will be provided by the Williams Settlement and State textbook allocation budgets.

Administrator Resciniti provided the Board with the annual matter of sufficiency of Instruction Materials per Ed Code §60119 and that each school district is required to hold a public hearing and adopt a resolution stating whether each student has a book.

Member Nunez questioned if the new math books delivered to sites were separated by section for teachers?

Administrator Resciniti stated that was correct.

President Vang OPENED the Public Hearing and hearing no speakers, CLOSED the Public Hearing and called for a motion.

Member Davis moved for approval, seconded by Member Mills, which carried a roll call vote of 6-0-3 as follows: Members Asadoorian, Davis, Johnson, Mills, Nunez, and President Vang, with *Member Ryan and Student Members Faccini, Thomas absent.*

**B-15, Unaudited Actual Financial Report for Fiscal Year 2007/08**

APPROVED, as recommended, the 2007/08 Unaudited Actual Financial Report for Fresno Unified School District represents the actual revenues, expenditures, and ending fund balances for all district funds for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2008.

CFO Quinto provided the Board with unaudited actual financial report for fiscal year 2007/08 as required by Ed Code. The presentation focused on the General Fund information and the ending balance summaries for other fund types. She informed the Board and the public that the Unaudited Actual Financial Report is required to be filed with the Fresno County Office of Education by September 15 every year.

She provided the Board with estimated actuals when she presented the budget in June and this report takes the estimated actuals and applies the year end closing procedures and with any adjustments that are necessary and the results is the Unaudited Actual Financial Report. She stated that this is in fact the report that is submitted to the district's independent auditors and they apply their audit procedures to this information.

Member Nunez questioned the 3.59% is in terms of people to people or is it in terms of dollar spent to the budget?

CFO Quinto stated that it is dollars spent and the actual calculation is included in the SACS report.

Member Nunez questioned if the figure comes from the district or state.

CFO Quinto stated the formula is driven by the state. Every school district that completes a SACS report will have the same calculation.

In conclusion, CFO Quinto stated that the results of the unaudited actuals are positive and the general fund results have been improved and are stable and the district continues to earmark funds for facility improvements and technology as well as other designations, and the districts central administrative ratio. Although there are still some challenges with the long-term liabilities; they continue to make good progress.

**B-15, Unaudited Actual Financial Report for Fiscal Year 2007/08** – *continued*

Superintendent Hanson addressed the penalty assessed by the State Allocation Board (SAB) and publicly thanked Assemblymember Juan Arambula for his assistance with the district's penalty that was assessed by the SAB and the Office of School Construction. The whole issue is fighting on not having to pay the penalty in full.

CFO Quinto thanked legal counsel and her legal staff for representing the district. The district filed a complaint with a variety of legal arguments and the State filed a complaint stating the district arguments had no merits and they requested a demurrer. The judge in the case issued a temporary ruling on Tuesday and if there is no opposition to the temporary ruling, the hearing is cancelled effectively and the temporary ruling goes from temporary to permanent. The judge in the case ruled that the district's arguments do have merits and informed the State that they don't agree there request for demurrer and ruled that this move forward. This is good news for Fresno Unified because it signifies that the district has a valid claim. They are hoping that they will prevail either through settlement, conference and negotiations or ultimately take this through to the end.

- They will be addressing the partnership with the State Board of Education, Thursday in Sacramento.
- Announced CIO Turnbull has been invited by the Council of Great City Schools to present on communications throughout the district.

President Vang acknowledged Assemblymember Arambula who addressed the Board, Superintendent, staff, and community members with a brief update on the State budget.

Comments were made by Member Nunez and Superintendent Hanson.
