Edison High School is in Fresno Unified School District (FUSD). FUSD serves over 73,000 students and is California's fourth largest school district. Over 83% of FUSD students live below the poverty line.

Edison is a comprehensive, four year public high school with an enrollment of approximately 2,600 students. Edison has two middle school feeder schools: a neighborhood middle school and a STEM/GATE Magnet middle school. Every student at Edison has equity and access to all academic and extra curricular activities and programs. Edison is the highest performing comprehensive high school in the FUSD.

## Grading and Ranking Rank

Class ranking is based on an augmented grade point average (see below) received for courses completed from the beginning of the 10<sup>th</sup> grade year through the end of the summer of the junior year. For Valedictorian status, a cumulative grade point average is used from the beginning of the 10<sup>th</sup> grade year through the third quarter of the senior year.

## Grade Point Average (GPA) Calculation

The grading system is: A=4, B=3, C=2, D=1, F=0 for all classes. The "augmented" GPA is calculated by adding .04 for each AP or Honors level course per semesters for which a grade of C or better was earned, with a maximum allowable addition of 0.32. The AGPA reflects grades earned in grades 10-12, and does not include P.E.

## EXTRA CURRICULAR OPPORTUNITIES

Edison has over 45 organized clubs on campus and countless others ways for students to get involved. Approximately 3% of Edison students are enrolled in our Principles of Leadership course. However, over 46% of students are involved in a club or activity outside of class.

## ATHLETIC OPPORTUNITIES

Edison has a proud athletic tradition. We currently offer 25 varsity sports for students to participate in. Approximately 29% of students are involved in athletics at some level.

## EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES

### PATHWAYS

Edison has four Career Technical Education Pathways that blend rigorous academics with career ready skills. Edison's pathways are four year programs of study in the S.T.E.M. field. Our pathways are BioMedicine, Engineering, Computer Science, and Green Technology (begins in 10th grade). Approximately 48% of Edison students are enrolled in a Pathway.

### CENTER FOR ADVANCED RESEARCH AND TECHNOLOGY (CART)

CART provides a state-of-the-art research and technology facility where students design and complete projects in collaboration with partners from the local, national, and international business community. Eleventh and twelfth grade students are bussed to CART where they attend half-day classes in one of the laboratories taught by teams of instructors from both education and business. Approximately 8% of Edison 11th and 12th grade students enroll at CART.

### REGIONAL OCCUPATION PROGRAM

The Fresno Regional Occupational Program (ROP) is career technical education that empowers students to make meaningful career choices by providing opportunities to explore their interests, develop career skills, and reinforce academics. Edison has one ROP Course (Athletic Training) and approximately 3% of Edison 11th and 12th grade students enroll in ROP.

### FRESNO COMMUNITY COLLEGE ENRICHMENT PROGRAM

Edison 11th and 12th grade students have the opportunity to enroll at Fresno City College to take coursework in the evenings. Less than 1% of Edison students enroll in the Enrichment Program.
