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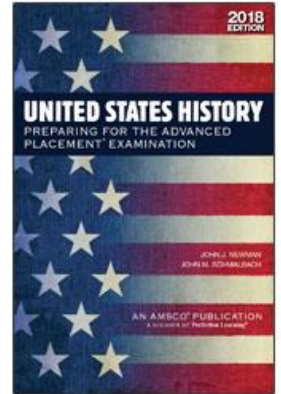

Your outline needs to be in your own words, should capture the most important ideas of the text, and should be thorough enough to answer the short answer questions fully from your notes alone. You may use roman numerals, bullet points or any other method of outlining, but it should have a basic structure similar to below.

Short Answer Questions:

Answers need to be in complete sentences and clearly labeled A, B, and C. Use at least 3 sentences for each response.

- Sentence # 1: Answer the question.
- Sentence # 2: Present your evidence and be very specific.
- Sentence # 3: Provide analysis to support your evidence.

Example SAQ:

Question 1

A. Briefly explain how ONE of the following factors in Europe in the early 16th century helped bring about a period of exploration and colonization of lands across the seas.

- Religion
- Trade
- Technology

Response:

A. During the early 16th century, European countries saw an increase in fervor as the new Protestants and united Catholic kingdoms in Spain wanted to spread their own versions of Christianity to people in the New World. For example, as the Spanish colonized areas in California they created a series of missions along the coast in order to convert the natives to Christianity. While the Spanish were also influenced by economic opportunities such as the desire to find gold, the desire to spread their religion was a major motivation for colonization of the New World.

*Since I just answered part of your homework question, you have to respond to one of the other two options (trade or technology) for credit on part A of question 1.
