

Superintendent Board Remarks from April 12, 2023

• Superintendent Nelson started his remarks expressing his gratitude to our bargaining team and SEIU for reaching a tentative agreement for our next contract period. • Superintendent Nelson then encouraged families again to enroll their eligible 3-, 4-, and 5year-olds in preschool, transitional kindergarten and kindergarten for the upcoming 2023-24 school year. The event will be held at the Old Administration Building from 11 a.m.-3 p.m.

• Superintendent Nelson then acknowledged April as Autism Awareness (or Acceptance) Month and as National School Library Month. Superintendent Nelson and the board shared their support for Autism Acceptance Month by wearing their royal blue.
