

Measure K: Improving Facilities FACT SHEET

\$199 million bond approved by community to improve school facilities

Voters approved a \$199 million FUSD Measure K Facilities Bond in 2001 to pay for construction, modernization and maintenance of Fresno Unified schools. The 10-year Measure K bond is allowing the district to reduce overcrowding by building new schools, provide state-of-the-art technology, and modernize aging school facilities. By combining Bond funds with state funds, the district maximizes the use of Measure K to build and improve schools.

Supporting student learning

Measure K has supported more than 1,000 FUSD facilities improvement and construction projects designed to support student learning including:

- Construction of new schools to reduce overcrowding
- Renovation and modernization of classrooms including electrical and lighting systems, heating and air conditioning, plumbing, carpets and flooring, ceilings, roofing and technology enhancements
- Improvements to restrooms, cafeterias, locker rooms, gyms, and pools
- Upgraded security, energy conservation and irrigation
- Installation of asphalt and paving for parking lots, tennis courts and play areas
- Installation of new playground equipment
- Enhanced disability accessibility to facilities

Providing consistent source of funding

Measure K finances a 10-year program to provide a consistent source of funding for facility projects district-wide. The combination of local funds from Measure K and state funds has helped FUSD complete \$175 million in facilities construction and maintenance projects throughout the district.
